MESSAGE FROM THE TRUSTEES

BY THE GRACE OF GOD we are emerging from the most challenging days of the Covid pandemic. It has been a complex time for our new institution, with the mosque closed entirely for several months, followed by months of careful restrictions on numbers and mandatory social distancing procedures. This included a cap of 400 attendees on Friday prayers, places for which had to be booked online. On July 19 most of these restrictions were lifted.

It has been heartening to see the congregation flowing back into its sacred space. We held three Eid prayers on each festival day, each one attracting a crowd which almost filled the mosque. Our popular guided tours have resumed and we are slowly dealing with the considerable backlog of people eager to join a tour!

Fatality rates in our community have been sadly high, and many congregants have reported the death of loved ones overseas as well. We continue to encourage visitors to wear face masks, to avoid the mosque if they are showing Covid symptoms, and not to shake hands or embrace. In November 2021, with an infection rate of 464 cases per 100,000 people, East Cambridgeshire surpassed Peterborough to reach the highest rate in the county, and we are encouraging everyone to maintain sensible precautions, especially with the risk of a winter or spring surge in transmission.

It has been a time of quiet isolation for many. We have seen the great mental health benefits of faith, as our people quietly wait for the fulfilment of Allah's decree, calmly accepting His wisdom, and praying for the wellbeing of their families, their neighbours, and for all mankind. May this be a time which, for all its difficulties, brings spiritual and moral renewal, and greater human solidarity.



SUNNA TSUNAMI IN PAKISTAN!

Our Mosque is proud to support Pakistan's worldleading plan to plant ten billion trees! Following the successful 'One Billion Tree Tsunami' in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, which achieved an 89% sapling survival rate, the country's Ministry of Climate Change began its hosting of the 2021 World Environment Day by announcing that another billion trees of various species had been planted across the country to cut carbon emissions and to observe the Sunna duty of creation care.

Pakistan is rated the world's fifth country most affected by climate change. Sunna-conscious Pakistanis are urging wealthier countries to do much more to cut their carbon emissions, whose burden falls most heavily on poorer regions of the world. BRITAIN TO RECEIVE BARAKA POWER

Morocco is now joint first with Sweden in the race to switch to renewable energy! Following massive support by Moroccan religious thinkers the country has initiated vast wind and solar power plants which now generate 42% of the African country's energy, with a target of 53% by the end of the decade. Over 1,200 of the country's imams have already received intensive training in methods of preaching on climate change and the need for zerocarbon mosques.

Energy-hungry Britain will benefit from the Xlinks Morocco-UK Power Project, which plans to connect the energy-rich Guelmim Oued Noun region exclusively to Britain via a three thousand mile long HVDC undersea cable. When complete the system will power over seven million British homes with light and warmth from the Muslim south! Cambridge Mosque Trust

Cambridge Islamic Art hosted its third exclusive art sale between 15th November and 30th December 2020 and triumphantly closed the online sale with all fifty-two works sold, raising £72,250 in aid of Europe's first eco-mosque. Artists hailed from the UK, Russia, Kazakhstan, Turkey, Japan, South Korea, China, Nigeria, Morocco, South Africa, Brazil, US, Italy, Spain, France and Saudi Arabia.

VACCINATIONS ON-SITE!

With the help of publicity from BBC Radio Cambridgeshire we have held several all-day pop-in Covid-19 Vaccination Clinics in the Atrium area of the mosque. Any local resident aged 18 or above was welcome to attend for their first or second free doses of the AstraZeneca or Pfizer vaccines. We also held an online Q&A session about the vaccine with NHS Cambridgeshire and Cambridge City Council.

FOOD RELIEF CONTINUES

Many thanks to the Cambridge Ethnic Community Forum, PAK Foods, Karim Foundation, Cambridge City Council, Al-Amin Stores, Euro Quality Lamb and others for their generous support for our food parcel programme for needy Muslim and non-Muslim families in the Cambridge area. Food poverty has been massively exacerbated by the Covid crisis. During the pandemic over 25% of BAME women reported difficulties in managing to feed their children, compared to a national average of 18%.

In collaboration with Islamic Relief, the Mosque has also been able to support Cambridge Sustainable Food with a variety of dry food items. 100 large food packs were distributed on the occasion of Eid al-Adha.

We have also provided hot meals for key workers at Royal Papworth Hospital. Cooking was by the team at Cambridge Gourmet Grill.

LIFE MEMBERS BOOM!

On October 3 the mosque was busy with attendees at our Life Member Event, at which no fewer than fifty-five new Life Members received their certificates and were inscribed in our Register.

PROVIDE THE GUIDES


Do you enjoy telling stories? Are you passionate about great architecture? Do you love meeting new people?
