

GREENING MUSLIMS

We are excited to be partnering with Cambridge University's Dr Davide Pettinato to co-develop and evaluate a multicomponent, Islam-literate environmental education intervention aimed at strengthening pro-environmental values, self-identity and personal norms among British Muslims.

The project's objectives are:

- to explore these values in the British Muslim community.
- to evaluate and compare the effectiveness (or lack thereof) of different types of mosquecentred interventions in strengthening British Muslims' pro-environmental ethics and sense of identity.
- to enable Cambridge Central Mosque to develop a holistic programme of Islamic environmental education which can become a model for other mosques in the UK and abroad.

Woodland Cemetery This Ramadan we are



officially opening our large woodland burial site to the Muslim public, following completion of access improvement works. Bookings are open now for individual and family plots. All interments are arranged with qualified funeral directors. To apply or for further information please visit gardensofrest. com or telephone 01638 600693.

In keeping with

the ethos of the Cambridge Central Mosque the site is managed in an ecologically-sustainable and Islamically-compliant manner. Burials will be directly in shrouds (kafan) or wicker coffins and the cemetery will be kept in a state of natural simplicity. The long-term appearance of the site will be a diverse meadow ecosystem with native tree copses.

We have begun instructional sessions on washing and shrouding the dead. The first session in November was for sisters only. Led by Shameela Islam-Zulfiqar, this event concluded with the award of certificates of competency.

We are grateful to the anonymous local resident who has generously gifted this property to the mosque as a Waqf.

I'tikāf Rules

There is high demand and limited space for I'tikāf at the Cambridge Central Mosque. As a result, priority is given as follows:

- Those who live in Cambridge (and surrounding areas)
- Those who did not perform I'tikāf at the mosque last year
- First-come, first-served.

Anyone performing I'tikāf at the mosque must remain in a state of I'tikāf for the full 10 days (or 9 in the case of a 29-day Ramadan). You will be expected at the Mosque by Asr of the 20th day of Ramadan.

And we have also started to arrange family walks in popular beauty spots outside Cambridge!




Following the success of our Ramadan children's activities last year we've launched *three* new clubs with engaging events and activities to inspire, nurture and strengthen!

'The charitable offerings are only for the poor, and the destitute and those who collect (the zakat) and those whose hearts are (to be) reconciled and for (liberating) slaves and debtors and in God's path, and the wayfarer, as an obligation from God and God is Knowing, Wise.'

(Holy Qur'an 9:60)




Blessings from Al-Quds!

Monty Don in Cambridge



Remembering A Forerunner

Halil Halid (1869-1931) is considered to have been the first Alim (Muslim religious scholar) in Cambridge. He served as a lecturer at Cambridge University between 1902 and 1911. Born on the Black Sea coast of Turkey to a distinguished family of ulema, he graduated from the Küçük Ayasofya Madrasa in Istanbul, and was an expert in all the Islamic scholarly disciplines. As well as teaching in Cambridge in the years before the Great War, he wrote regularly for the Turkish newspaper Servet-i Fünun and authored several reflections on life in Western Europe at the time. He also served for a time as Ottoman Vice-Consul in London. His books include Diary of a Turk, and Algerian Memoirs. On his return to Turkey he was elected to the Ottoman parliament, after which he became a theology lecturer at Istanbul University (Darul Fünun). He lies buried in the Merkez Efendi cemetery in Istanbul.

On November 14, Diana Darke joined us for the launch of her new book Islamesque: The Forgotten Craftsmen who Built Europe's Medieval Monuments. In this book, Darke, a British author who has lived for many years in Damascus, explains how many of the highlights of medieval European church architecture are the result of influence by Muslim craftsmen and artists.

Our mosque does not have a bookshop, but visitors can collect free copies of Muslim Book News, which showcases leading publications by Cambridge-based Islamic publishers, which can then be ordered online. Cambridge is a major hub for Muslim publishing, being the home of the Islamic Texts Society, CMC Press, the Quilliam Press, the Muslim Academic Trust, Lote Tree Press, and Equilibra Press.

Some of us have no words at all for where it began, or where it is taking us, but still feel it in our depths. That is the tragedy of the forgetting of Truth, and there is no greater tragedy, and no deeper sorrow. Such people have great rights over us.

All of the Five Pillars of Islam are Divine gifts which help us to understand the journey and to find serenity and hope at every stage along the way. Every pain and misfortune is bearable if we know that we come from God's Beauty, and are travelling towards it once again.

Once we know this we can start to understand the deep mystery of the holy month of Ramadan.

Allah is al-Rahman, the All-Compassionate. The flow of life and being itself is directed by this holy name. We can swim properly and blissfully in this sea which moves from Him and to Him if we beautify our lives with perfect spiritual forms. Once we are living in the pure shape of the Sunna, we can open our eyes properly, and see the world correctly, with our hearts and minds, and also with our senses.

During the holy month, even forgetful people gain increased love and respect for the True God. It is a time of mingled seriousness and joy. And both are lessons in the reality of existence. God has not created this world in jest. Neither does He wish us to grieve. The happy soul is the one which sees that what exists is what He commands, and that we are all fish in the river which flows to the same Compassionate Source.

During these days we hear and read and breathe the Timeless Book of Revelation: the blessed Qur'an. It is like a diamond, with as many facets as it has verses. Its pure beauty shines on our hearts in so many ways; when we embark upon the voyage of the Khatm, we travel through well-loved familiar lands. We pass through valleys and great mountain ranges. We hear the divine Voice ourselves, as we are immersed in Heaven's clear waters.

Once again we hear Surat al-Rahman, Surat al-Mulk, Surat al-Insan. We are refreshed and find our bearings on earth once again. The world in its distractions and worldliness grows faint and distant, as we hear the Eternal and Infinite sounds. What privilege could be more glorious? What honour more majestic?

The Night of Power comes, and we hope to feel its presence. It is better than a thousand months, since time is in quality not quantity. It is the night in which the uncreated Speech came down to our world. Even our impure and tired ears listen to it, and our hearts are amazed. The Angels and the Spirit descend also. It is peace, until the rising of the dawn.

Fortunate Umma of the Best of Prophets! Such a robe of honour is placed on our shoulders as we bow our heads together to the Merciful Lord!
